Accommodation

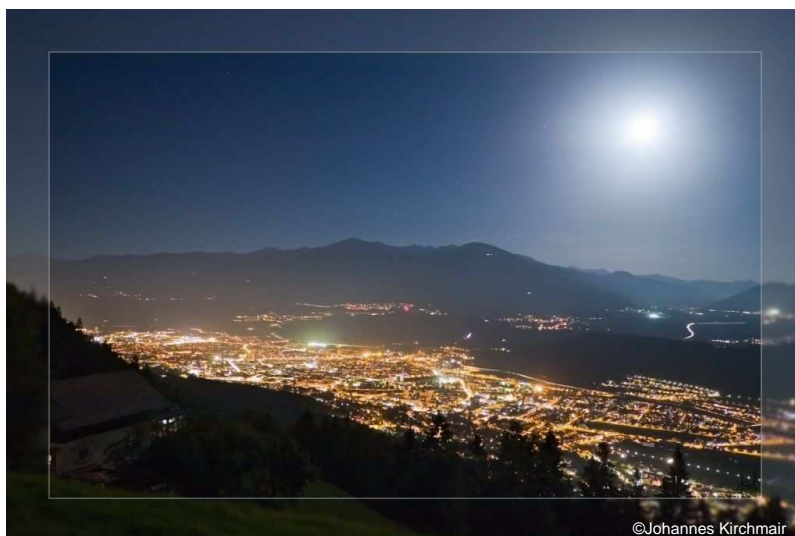
Innsbruck offers a number of nice hotels at a reasonable price. Hotel accommodation has to be organized by the delegates themselves.

Innsbruck – the capital of the Alps (575m)



Innsbruck is the capital city of the federal state of Tyrol in western Austria. It is located in the Inn Valley between high mountains like the Nordkette in the north and Patscherkofel and Serles in the south. The University of Innsbruck is founded 1669. The symposium venue will be at the Theological Faculty, a historical building of the University.
